MOTHER SETON ACADEMY CELEBRATES 20 YEARS OF SUCCESS

We are all very excited to be celebrating Mother Seton Academy's 20th year of service as a tuition-free, independent Catholic middle school serving families and children living in Baltimore City. Mother Seton Academy was founded in 1993 but the roots of MSA began to form in 1991 when the provincial leaders of the religious congregations within the Archdiocese of Baltimore endorsed an innovative educational project, involving collaboration among several religious congregations. The provincial leaders of interested congregations appointed a task force to investigate this idea and formulate a plan to meet the academic and social needs of low-income middle school

children often prohibited from attending Catholic schools due to financial limitations. Utilizing the successful Nativity School model and adapting it to meet the specific needs of Baltimore, the vision for Mother Seton Academy was born. Since no individual religious community had the resources to undertake such a project alone, the project became a collaborative effort among six religious congregations with long traditions of service to Baltimore. The members of the founding group were Sr. Nancy Crossen, OSF, Sr. Jacqueline Kotz, OSF, Sr. Joan Keating, DC, Sr. Claire Parenteau, OSF, Bro. James Kelly, CFX, Doris Musil, Archdiocese of Baltimore, Bro. Arthur Caliman, CFX, Sr. Therese O'Rourke, IHM (Scranton), Sr. Mary Anne Hartnett, SSND, and Blair Raum, Pastor of St. Patrick Parish. Jamie Glover, School Counselor at Mother Seton Academy, joined the staff in November 2013. She is originally from Birmingham, MI, a suburb of Detroit. Mrs. Glover earned her B.S. and M.A. degrees from Wayne State University and taught elementary education in Detroit Public Schools for four years in addition to serving as a high school counselor at several Detroit area public schools. After her husband was transferred to the Baltimore area last year, she began searching for a new position and was attracted to MSA for its mission and reputation. Although she says there is no typical day when you work in a school setting, normally Mrs. Glover begins her day responding to phone calls and emails.
