TABLE TALKS: OUR VOICES, YOUR EARS

Since its start fourteen years, Bro. Jesse O'Neil, SM headed up Mother Seton Academy's 8th-grade speech public speaking class and instructed students on its importance. He diligently worked with our young boys and girls throughout the year to prepare them for their final project, the 8th-grade speech competition. The speech competition was always a highlight of the year. It allowed our graduating students the ability to shine in front of their families, friends, teachers, and supporters. This being the first school year without Bro. Jesse, there were some big shoes to fill (figuratively and literally).

Ms. Guin Phoebe, the 8th-grade Language Arts and Literature teacher, volunteered to step up and take on this new responsibility. As with any task taken over by someone else, new ideas were brought to the table. Being the innovative teacher she is, Ms. Phoebe wanted to integrate the speeches into the student's everyday learning. This year, instead of picking an individual from CNN's Hero list to give a speech on Ms. Phoebe had each student pick a research question that inspired them. Each student then did an in-depth study and wrote a research paper on that question. They then prepared a four-minute overview to present to a small discussion group for a "Table Talk." This unique new format had students finding something they were passionate about and learning enough to be able to discuss it. The students worked on





their projects for several months under the guidance of Ms. Phoebe and Bro. Tom Trager, SM, who assisted Bro. Jesse for years with the speech competition.

During their "Table Talks," students would have two to three individuals at their table who listened to their project overview and then discuss it with them. Each group of individuals had five minutes with the student and could then move on to listen to another student's presentation. The 8th-grade students chose a wide variety of thought-provoking subjects, including: what challenges do American school systems face and how to address them, how does poverty affect society, what are the most effective therapies for children suffering from trauma, and what are the struggles faced by veterans, and how can we better support them. Our students did a fabulous job addressing these questions and got their audiences engaged in each subject.

Everyone who attended the "Table Talks" thought it was a refreshing way for our students to present a research subject. They also loved the opportunity to talk with each of our talented young presenters. We are very grateful for all the staff and volunteers who organized this event, and to the families, friends, and supporters who came to cheer them on. Every one of you helped to make this new event the tremendous success it was, thank you!
