The capital campaign: *Building* Hope, *Changing* Futures was launched several years ago to raise \$7,000,000 for the renovation of the building on Greenmount Avenue. Proudly, the Board of Directors announced in January that they met their goal. This great achievement was due to the unwavering support of the sponsoring religious organizations, foundations, and the many generous friends of Mother Seton Academy. The Board expressed its deep gratitude for such generosity.

Whiting-Turner Contracting Company began renovation in July 2008. The goal was to complete the extensive project by August 2009. After
