MSA Graduate Giving Back

As a middle school, Mother Seton Academy only has its students for three years, but its impact on those young girls and boys goes far beyond the 6th, 7th, and 8th grades. The core values of community, philanthropy, and becoming productive leaders in society stay with our graduates forever. A beautiful example of this came when one of our alumni, Yolanda Vargas, reached out to our Graduate Support Director, Lisa Knickmeyer, LMSW in May of this year.

Yolanda, Class of 2007, said that her time at Mother Seton Academy “formed me and shaped my experience here as an immigrant. It opened opportunities for me to begin to create my own American Dream.” Additionally, “Mother Seton Academy prepared me for high school and beyond by providing meaningful relationships and rigorous academics. [This school] shaped me to view life with more care and understanding. [Showing me how] important it is to give back to the community.” After graduating from St. Paul’s School for Girls in 2011. Yolanda pursued her degree in Sociology with a minor in Spanish and International Studies at Frostburg University. There Yolanda found a passion for teaching and working with children. She turned that love for education and children into a career and currently works as a Spanish teacher at the Academy for College

and Career Exploration in Baltimore City. This past summer, she also worked as the Camp Director at the Schuster Foundation’s River Farm Day Camp.

She reached out to Mother Seton Academy earlier this year to offer our current students the opportunity to enjoy everything the River Farm Day Camp had to offer. Yolanda said that she thought of us for this wonderful day camp because “the River Farm Camp is an amazing opportunity for students of Baltimore to experience... especially during this difficult time. Many students did not get the opportunity to enjoy or experience a summer. I thought of Mother Seton Academy because when I went there, it gave me meaningful field trips. I’d like to think I am running a meaningful camp for students. I wanted to give back to Mother Seton Academy by giving the opportunity for students to experience the Eastern Shore like never before.”

Looking Back through the Eyes of Our 8th-Graders

Twice a year Mother Seton Academy students write letters to their sponsors. They talk about their experiences, favorite classes, where they're struggling, and more. This year, being almost completely online, they jointly wrote a letter to share with their benefactors. It was so touching and heart-felt, we wanted to share it with all of you wonderful supporters, who make our work possible.

Dear Donors and Benefactors,

The entire 8th grade of Mother Seton Academy writes this letter for the final time to say thank you, God Bless, and show our gratitude and appreciation for everything you have done and continue to do for Mother Seton. The donors and benefactors have made it possible for things like school trips, amazing moments of connection, and brand-new supplies to be given to each class. Our class will never forget the amazing way that Mother Seton Academy has changed our lives, and it is because of the donors and benefactors that we were able to forge the connections we did over the last three years.

Three years ago, we came into Mother Seton as fresh 6th graders. The school was beautiful, clean, and scarily

new to us. We did not know what the next three years would hold for us as a class. From class trips to Terrapin adventures (we'll never forget the giant swing!) to seeing Aladdin live at the Hippodrome (the genie was our favorite) and all of the small events in between- field day at the park with our friends and teachers, career days where we learned about various opportunities for work in the world, Catholic Schools Week is a time to come together and celebrate our school and its mission- our experience at Mother Seton was also an experience of the bigger world. We didn't just learn in a classroom about geometry and metaphors and the history of the United States, but we learned about each other, our community, and the world overall.

Some of the most demanding parts of our time happened in the 8th grade. We took admissions tests and waited, probably impatiently, for high school acceptances to come out. We drafted and redrafted scholarship letters. In our classes, we focused on essays, reading actual Shakespeare, writing our own poetry and performing it, and, at the end of the year, culminating a large research project with a 5 minutes speech and presentation.

Some of the most beautiful parts of our experience happened in 8th grade, too. This is especially true of our trip to Cape May.

Cape May was a life-changing experience for the entire 8th grade. After a year was largely upended because of the pandemic, we desperately needed time as a class to remember why we feel so connected. Cape May was our chance to get closer to each other, to God, and to the overall message of Mother Seton Academy. It is a memory we will have for the rest of our lives.

Again we want to thank you, earnestly, from the bottom of our hearts for all you do for Mother Seton Academy. This school is life-changing, and it is that way because of donors and benefactors like you.
