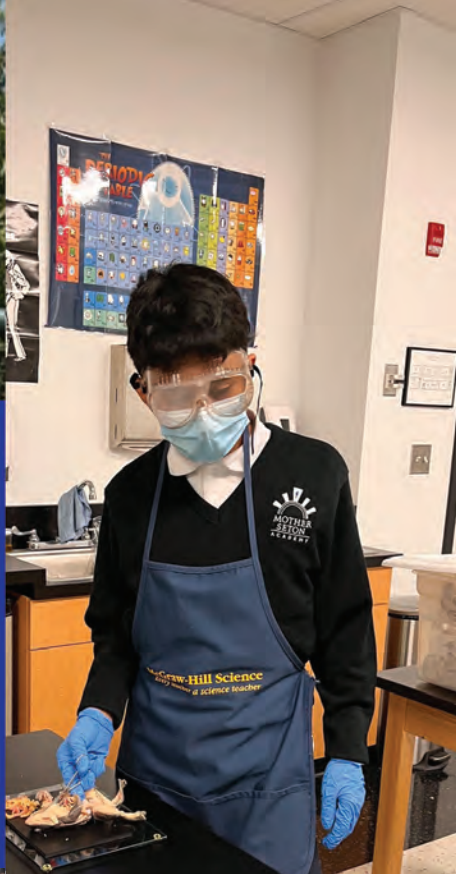


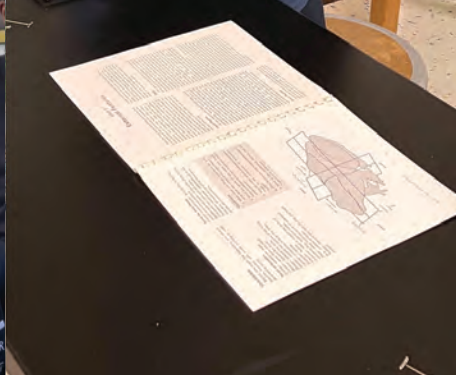
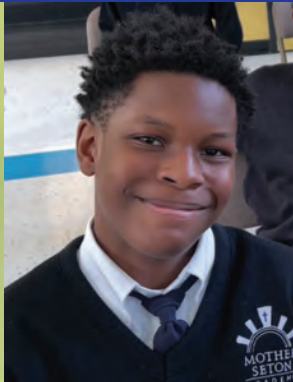

Now, let me give a cheer to all of YOU saints. Despite any challenges in your lives, you continue to help make miracles happen every day at Mother Seton Academy.

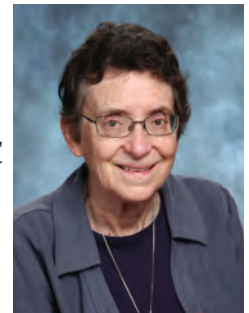
Thank you for the kindness and generosity you have shown to Mother Seton Academy over the past year. Your support of our mission makes a huge difference in the lives of our students.

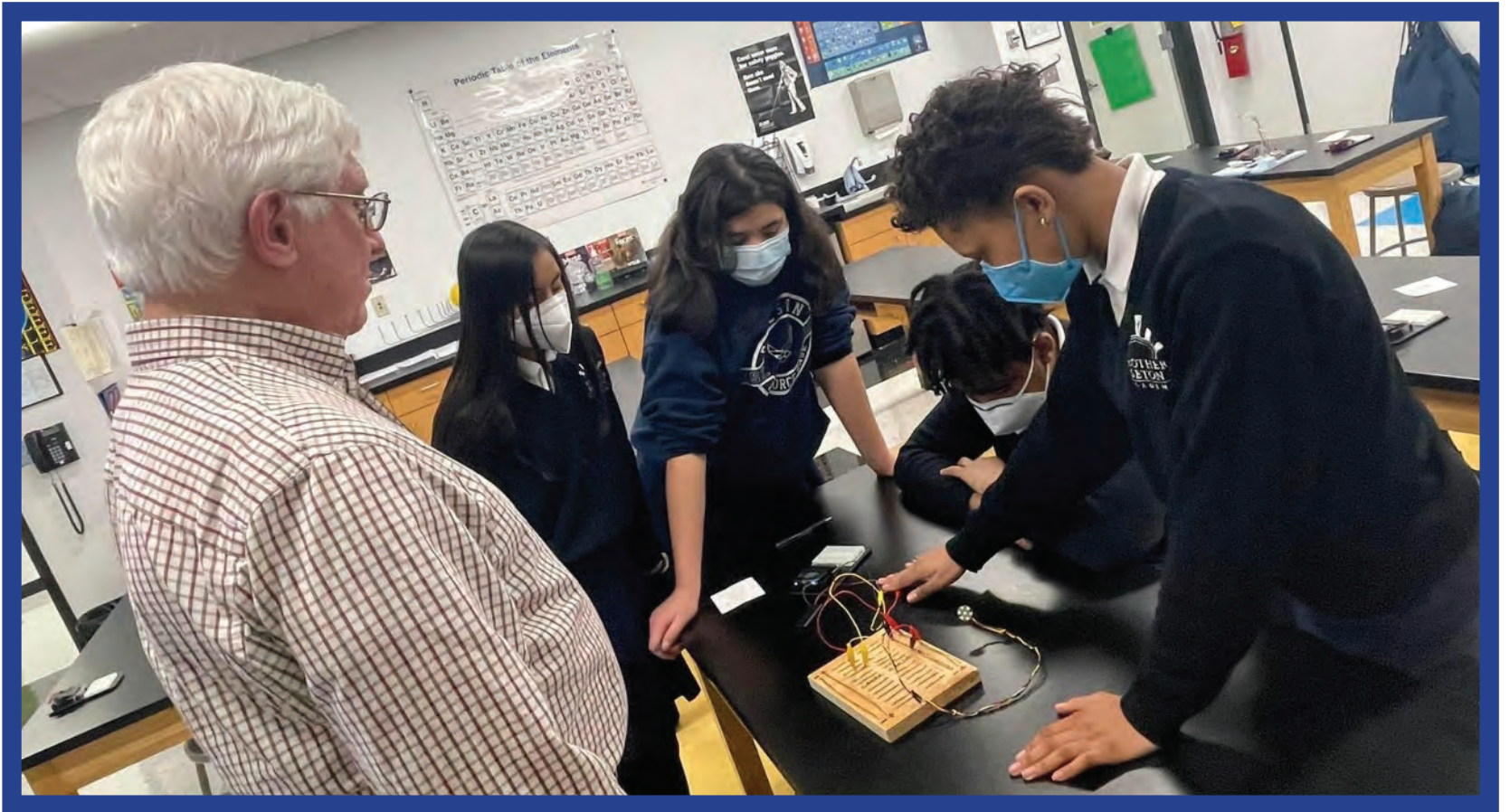

# *Dedicated to the Mission*

People who believe in the mission of Mother Seton Academy are the lifeblood of our work. People who not only believe but also give of their treasures and time are some of the most precious supporters who make our efforts possible. One such individual we wanted to highlight is Joe Heideman, a donor and volunteer at Mother Seton Academy.

Joe started volunteering at Mother Seton Academy in 2017, where he led a LEGO club and tutored students in math during our extended day program. He shared that he wanted to volunteer “because I enjoy sharing things I love, such as math and robotics, with the students.” “Seeing the look of delight on their faces and in their voices when they begin to understand something new and say “I can do that,” is what he said he enjoys the most. Joe has recently introduced students to electronic programming and hardware through Micro-bits. This pocket-sized computer helps transform digital skills into an easy hands-on experience for our young girls and boys. When asked to recall a special memory with the students, Joe spoke about seeing our eighth-graders doing their year-end speeches in June. He said, “it was incredible seeing them so full of confidence and bravery standing in front of their peers and faculty, speaking so eloquently about the things that mattered most to them. This kind of thing is only possible when

the students feel safe and have incredible guidance from their teachers.” Joe said that what makes Mother Seton Academy so special “is the students and their enthusiasm for learning. Of equal importance is the care and dedication of the entire Mother Seton Academy staff for the students.”

He stated why he chooses to help the school by volunteering and contributing financially: “supporting Mother Seton Academy is a genuine and direct opportunity to help create a better future for our children, ourselves, and our world... There are so many opportunities to donate to good causes in this world. What makes donating to Mother Seton Academy special is that you can see immediate results with the smiles of the students when they have opportunities for learning that would have otherwise eluded them without your contribution... It is these opportunities and experiences that help prepare them to face and overcome the demanding and sometimes harsh realities of adult life.”

Joe Heideman, and supporters like you, who believe in the mission of Mother Seton Academy, play an integral role in keeping the work of Mother Seton Academy alive. Thank you for being so dedicated to helping our young girls and boys have opportunities for bigger and brighter futures.

# Providing Opportunities to Grow

As a school, Mother Seton Academy works hard to provide underserved students with unique opportunities to grow and stretch themselves. One such way is by having art and music classes integrated into the school's regular curriculum. Students benefit greatly from having these creative outlets to explore and learn new skills. You also never know what kind of passion for the arts this exposure can instill in our young girls and boys.

This is especially true of Armoni Gaddy, Mother Seton Academy Graduate of the Class of 2013. From the tender age of three, when Armoni started learning to play the piano, her passion for music grew until she was introduced to a new instrument she hadn't known before, the harp. "When Mother Seton Academy had The Peabody Institute musicians come to the school, it was the first time I had seen a harp. From that moment on, I started taking lessons there and joined Peabody's HarpAdventures program," Armoni shared. This program, through John Hopkins Peabody Institute, helps make harp instruments and lessons more accessible for inner-city Baltimore children. Through the guidance of Mother Seton Academy's Graduate Support program, Armoni went on to Cristo Rey for High School. During her time there, she was introduced

to the British Studies Summer Program (BSSP), an all-scholarship summer study/travel program that gives academically capable and highly deserving high-school students opportunities to explore British culture. "It was an awesome experience to travel outside of the country, and I was there when the 2016 Brexit took place and the (late) Queen Elizabeth II's 90th birthday! I was also invited to attend a party that same year at the British Embassy, where I had the chance to informally play a song in front of the British ambassador and his wife!" Armoni continued her educational journey at Loyola University in New Orleans, where she graduated in May of 2021 with a Bachelor's in Music Industry Studies. "I had the best college experience there, especially for music! I was in the university choir, band, & orchestra. I was able to do studio music recordings for my music industry classes and sit in on forums with some famous music artists, musicians, managers, etc. I also worked under my orchestra conductor's youth orchestra program, the Greater New Orleans Youth Orchestra (GNOYO), where I almost had the opportunity to go to France for a music tour, but COVID messed up those plans." Armoni said that Mother Seton Academy really helped her with how it "promoted educational and interpersonal growth and how it is a school that does it best to reach out to

current students and even alumni. I always found that Mother Seton Academy was an awesome resource with dependable faculty/staff." Armoni Gaddy is a shining example of how Mother Seton Academy can help our students find and grow their passions through opportunities they may otherwise not have known. When asked what she would like to share with you, the supporters of the school, she asked, "please continue to give support to our inner city youth. Schools like Mother Seton Academy provide unique opportunities for students and gives a space for students to grow. These opportunities have helped a student like me! I am someone that is eager to still grow because of the experience I had here!"

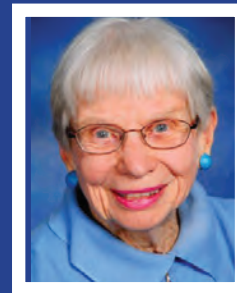

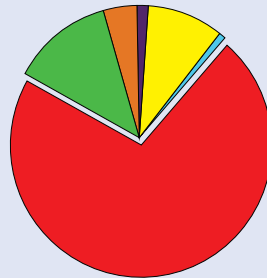

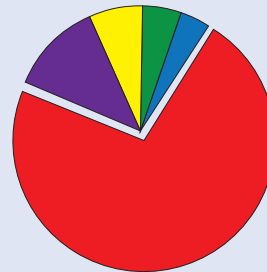
